Inclusive participation remains at the heart of Samajam's efforts. Initiatives such as Ramayana Masam and



### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE


The year 2024 marked a significant chapter in Singapore Malayalee Hindu Samajam's journey, characterised by steady progress and in the strengthening of our community spirit.



### KEY HIGHLIGHTS

#### (A) VIRTUAL EVENTS

#### VIRTUAL RAMAYANA PAARAYANAM

From 16 July to 16 August 2024, the Samajam organised a month-long online recitation of the epic *Ramayana* in observance of the sacred month of *Karkidakam* (zodiac sign of Cancer). Devotees participated with great enthusiasm, engaging in the daily readings and reflecting on the scripture.









The observance concluded with a well-attended final prayer gathering held at the Holy Tree Balasubramaniyar Temple, marking the culmination of a spiritually enriching month.

#### **DEVI MAHATMYAM PARAYANAM**

The Samajam hosted a two-day virtual recitation of the *Devi Mahatmyam* on October 11 and 12, 2024. The event concluded with the *Navaratri*.

On the first day, participants recited the *Pradhama* and *Madhyama* Charithams (Chapters 1-4) recounting the Devi's manifestations and triumphs over evil. The *Uthama Charitham* (Chapters 5-13) was recited on the second day, further invoking the Goddess's role as the supreme cosmic force and nurturer.

#### VISHWA BHAGAVATA PRAYAG

From November 24 to 30, 2024, the Samajam conducted the *Vishwa Bhagavatha Prayag*, a spiritually enriching week-long *virtual* recitation of the Srimad Bhagavatham. This global initiative brought together devotees from across continents in a shared celebration of Lord Krishna's *leelas* (stories of Lord Krishna's life and the timeless lessons.)

# (B) COMMUNITY MOMENTS PARIHARA POOJA AND KOOTTAPRAARTHANA



Since the beginning of 2024, these monthly prayer gatherings have been held at the Holy Tree Sri Balasubramaniar Temple.











These prayers are dedicated to seeking direction and blessings for the setting up of a temple for Swami Ayyappan and Sri Guruvayurappan in Singapore.

#### **SKANDA SHASHTI**



The Samajam commemorated *Skanda Shashti* on November 2, 2024, at SVKT, honouring Lord Murugan's triumph over evil. The day included a morning *abhishekam*, followed by an evening *ubhayam pooja* and the chanting of the *Skanda Shashti Kavacham*.

#### AADI CHOWA

On July 23, 2024, the Samajam had the honour of serving as ubhayakar during the Aadi Chowa celebrations at SVKT, a sacred occasion that highlights the spiritual importance of Tuesdays in the month of Aadi.

The observance was dedicated to Goddess Durga, with a sequence of traditional rituals including abhishekam (ceremonial bathing of deities), bhajans (singing of hymns), and special poojas for all the deities.









#### **KUCHELADINAM**

On December 18, 2024, Samajam observed *Kucheladinam* at SVKT. The celebration centred around *Avil Nivedyam pooja*, a symbolic offering of beaten rice to Lord Guruvayoorappan, commemorating the legendary devotion of *Kuchela* (*Sudama*) and his selfless friendship with Lord Krishna.

# (C) SIGNATURE CELEBRATIONS CHAKKULATHUKAVU BHAGAVATHY AMMAN CELEBRATION

From May 17 to 19, 2024, devotees gathered at Birch Road under the revered guidance of Sadguru Brahma Shree Radhakrishnan Thirumeni for a spiritually enriching celebration steeped in cultural and religious tradition.

The three-day event featured a series of sacred rituals, including pushparchana, floral offerings to the divine, kumkumarchana, veneration with vermilion, and paalkudam, a ceremonial procession with milk pots symbolizing purity and abundance.











#### KUMKUMARCHANA

Devotees also participated in Saneeswara pooja, seeking relief from adversities, and guruthi pooja, a ritualistic offering to deities for harmony and prosperity.

The celebration concluded with the pongala—a powerful act of devotion where hundreds of participants prepared ritual offerings collectively, fostering a profound sense of unity and spiritual fulfillment.



### GURUVAYOOR EKADASHI & SRIMAN NARAYANEEYAM CHANTING



The Samajam devoted a week to harmonize two sacred observances to honour Lord Guruvayoorappan: Guruvayoor Ekadashi, and the virtual recitation of Sriman Narayaneeyam,

From December 7 to 10, 2024, devotees united globally via Zoom for a daily virtual recitation of the Sriman Narayaneeyam. The Guruvayoor Ekadashi celebrations commenced at SVKT on December 9, 2024. Daily rituals including ubaya poojas, Vishu sahasranama, archanai and special poojas were performed with devotion.







The week culminated on December 11, with the completion of Sriman Narayaneeyam chanting in-person alongside Ekadashi Vilakku at SVKT.





#### MANDALA-MAKARAVILAKKU CELEBRATIONS



MORNING ABISHEKAM

The Samajam ushered in a spiritually significant period from November 16, 2024, to January 15, 2025, with the sacred mandala-makaravilakku observances, marked by devotion and participation at SVKT. The Samajam organised special poojas to mark both the commencement and conclusion of the 41-day pilgrimage, held on November 16 and December 26, respectively.

From December 27 to 29, 2024, the temple beautifully mirrored Sabarimala. The pathinettam padi 18 holy steps







leading to the Sanctum were symbolically constructed and lit with the traditional ghee lamps, accompanied by bhajans devotional chants. The final day featured a pushpabhishekam, during which the deity was adorned with floral offerings, drawing heartfelt participation from the devotees.

The season culminated in the makara vilakku panchakala poojas which was held from January 13 to 15, 2025, in alignment with Makar Sankranti.

# (D) CHILDREN'S PROGRAMME BALASADANAM

Samajam's dedication to nurturing spiritual and cultural values in the younger generation continues through *Balasadanam*, a weekly online programme for children.





#### **QUARTERLY OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES**

Each session is designed to be interactive and enriching, combining storytelling, role play, arts and crafts, quizzes, games, and value-based discussions. In addition to the weekly virtual classes, quarterly in-person gatherings are organized to create opportunities for children to have deeper spiritual understanding and hands-on learning.

The children showcase their talents through vibrant performances during the annual Krishna Jayanthi and Vijayadasami celebrations.

#### (E) DISCOURSE

#### SPIRITUAL AWAKENING BY SWAMI VINAYAKANANDA MAHARAJ JI

On June 30, 2024, a thought-provoking spiritual discourse by Swami Vinayakananda Maharaj Ji was held at Ayush Ayurvedic Centre, Race Course Road. The session inspired attendees to reflect deeply on the purpose of life through the lens of spirituality and self-realisation. This meaningful engagement reinforced Samajam's efforts to provide platforms for spiritual growth and introspection within the community.
